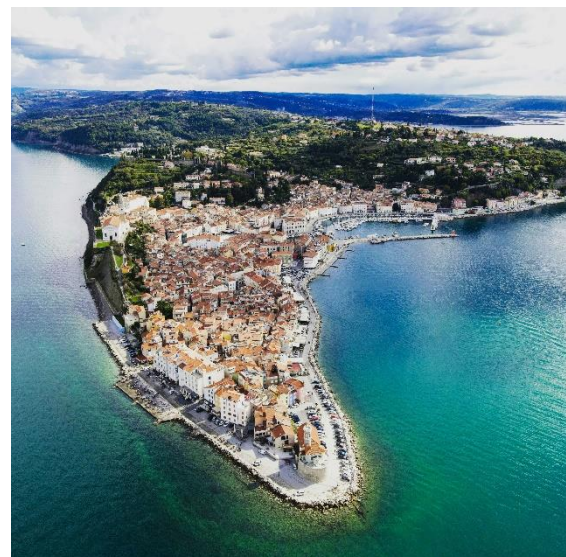

Type of trip: self-drive tour in Slovenia and Northern Croatia (Ljubljana – Ljubljana)

INTRODUCTION

Slovenia is a beautiful little country bordered by the Julian Alps to the north and Croatia to the south. The most famous village in the Alps is **Bled**. It has a small coastline known for its beautiful beaches, with towns such as **Piran**, **Portorož** and **Koper**. Historically, it has been a crossroads for trade routes between the Italian Po Valley and the Croatian Pannonian Plain, as well as between central Europe and the Adriatic Sea and the Balkans. Long dominated by the Austrians, the Slovenes have managed to preserve their identity. As in the days of Yugoslavia, they have maintained their traditional activities while adapting to domestic and international markets. Recognizing its strategic position, Napoleon developed the capital **Ljubljana** in the center of the country. Today, Slovenia is one of the greenest countries in Europe with a small but dynamic economy. Its natural beauty is magnificent, with **the Triglav National Park** and **the Postojna Caves**. The orderly mentality of the Slovenian people means that they are very concerned with land use planning and beauty in general. You will also discover many charming little sites that will make you feel right at home.



Croatia is striking for its unusual shape. The arc formed by the country can be explained by its history and very specific challenges, which have contributed to Croatia's wealth and diversity today. The country combines a long coastline with one of the highest concentrations of islands in the world, marked by the Mediterranean context and the Pannonian continental plains closely linked to the Austro-Hungarian plains. These two landscapes are bordered by the Julian Alps to the north and the Dinaric Alps, which extend down to Greece. Whether on the coast or in the plains, Croatians have always been a trading people, benefiting from their

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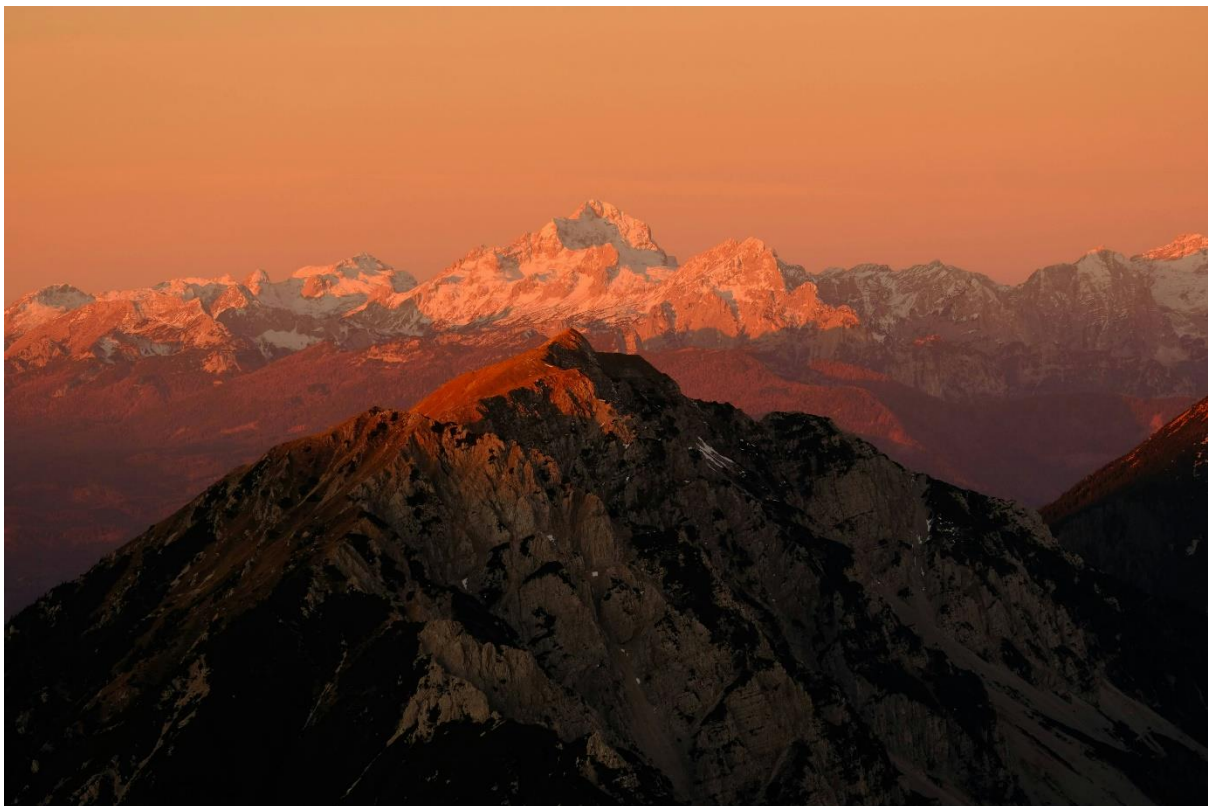
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position at the crossroads of multiple trade routes dating back to ancient times and even further into the past. The town of **Lošinj**, for example, was the site of an ancient Greek colony. The Roman heritage is best linked to the city of **Pula**. The tumultuous medieval past can be seen in the Venetian influences on the coastline with the city of Rovinj and Austrian influences inland and in certain resort areas such as **Opatija**.



Croatia's strategic position and wealth have made it a coveted target. All the joy and melancholy of the country can be found in its highly original and typical naive art from the plains and the delicate sculptures of the stonemasons from the Mediterranean coast. Traveling through Croatia means discovering a wide variety of landscapes and regions that are constantly changing, each with its own unique, strong identity shaped by the influences that have marked them. This journey will transport you as you discover natural gems on its 1,200 islands, such as **Cres**, **Krk** and **Lošinj**, or in the plateaus with national parks and numerous waterfalls... A richness that also delights the palate, as it translates into a diverse and appetizing cuisine. From the scents of the Mediterranean sea to the gentle sounds of waterfalls... a total delight for the senses!



YOUR JOURNEY



PROGRAM

Day 1: Arrival at Ljubljana Airport - overnight stay in Bled

Flight arriving at Ljubljana Airport.

Pick up an IFAR category vehicle, such as a Cupra Formentor or similar, for 15 days (see “rental conditions”).

Drive to Bled. Journey time: 30 min.

Check in at the 4* Adora Hotel. Accommodation in a 65 m² Executive Luxury Suite with two bedrooms, a living room, and a bathroom. (This suite is not listed on their website). Parking included.

The Adora Hotel is a small, luxury 4-star boutique hotel located on the shores of Lake Bled, just outside the village. It is a former 19th-century villa, restored to offer seven high-end suites combining old-world charm and modern comforts with an intimate and warm atmosphere.



Lunch and dinner not included.

Day 2: Lake Bled - overnight stay in Bled

Breakfast at the hotel.

Explore the village and Lake Bled at your leisure. We recommend taking a trip on a traditional Pletna boat to the island of St. Mary in the center of the lake.

Bled is one of the most beautiful villages in the Slovenian Julian Alps. It is located at the foot of the iconic Triglav massif, on the edge of a lake surrounded by high mountains, in the center of which is an island with the monastery of St. Mary. High above the lake is the castle, offering a splendid view of Bled and the mountains. We recommend a boat trip to the island of St. Mary or an easy walk around the lake. Bled is renowned for its thermal waters and pastries, particularly its mille-feuille.



Return and overnight stay at the Adora Hotel in Bled.
Lunch and dinner not included.

Day 3: Vintgar Gorge and Radovljica village - overnight stay in Bled

Breakfast at the hotel.

Drive to the Vintgar Gorge.

Travel time: 20 min.

Explore Vintgar Gorge Park at your leisure. Admission not included, to be paid on site. *Vintgar is a very narrow and mysterious canyon carved out by the Radovna River, which forms a series of waterfalls ending with the imposing 13-meter-high Šum waterfall. Paths are built into the very walls of the canyon.*



Drive to the village of Radovljica.

Travel time: 30 min.

Explore the village of Radovljica at your leisure.

Radovljica is a charming little medieval village with well-preserved 15th and 16th century architecture. We recommend visiting the Gingerbread Museum, which showcases the Slovenian art of making and decorating heart-shaped gingerbread.



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Return and overnight stay at the Adora Hotel in Bled.

Lunch and dinner at your leisure.

Day 4: Hike in the Bistrice Valley - overnight stay in Bled

Breakfast at the hotel.

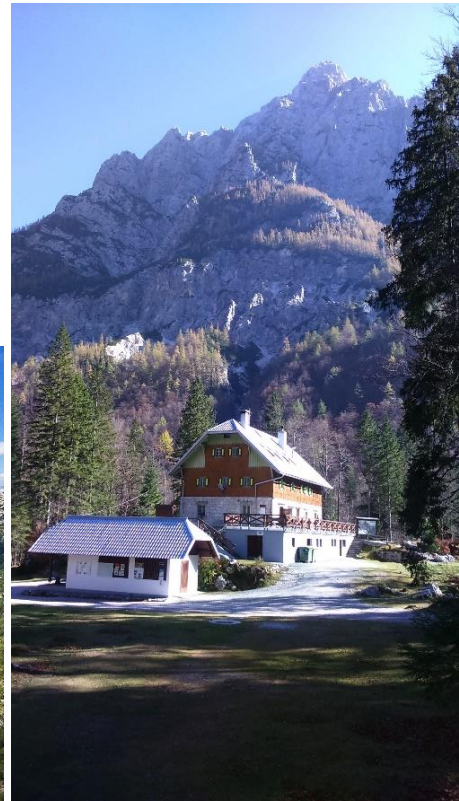
Drive to the village of Mojstrana. Travel time: 40 min.

Triglav National Park is Slovenia's only national park. Mount Triglav takes its name from its triple peak, which forms a trident shape. It rises to an altitude of 2,864 m and is the symbol of Slovenia, appearing on the country's national flag. The park offers many hiking opportunities to discover the majestic landscapes of the Julian Alps.

Hike in Triglav National Park on the famous "Triglavška Bistrica" hiking trail.

The trail is linear and follows the small, milky-watered Bistrica River as it winds between the mountain slopes. It takes you through magnificent landscapes with interesting morphological phenomena, such as galleries formed in layers of conglomerate over thousands of years, to its source. The views of the mountain peaks from the mountain hut are breathtaking. You will also see the Triglav peak.

Distance: 11.2 miles – Actual walking time: 4 hours 15 minutes
– Hiking time with breaks: 5 hours 15 minutes – Average difficulty: 3/5 – Elevation gain: 2,200 feet.



Return and overnight stay at the Adora Hotel in Bled.

Lunch and dinner not included.

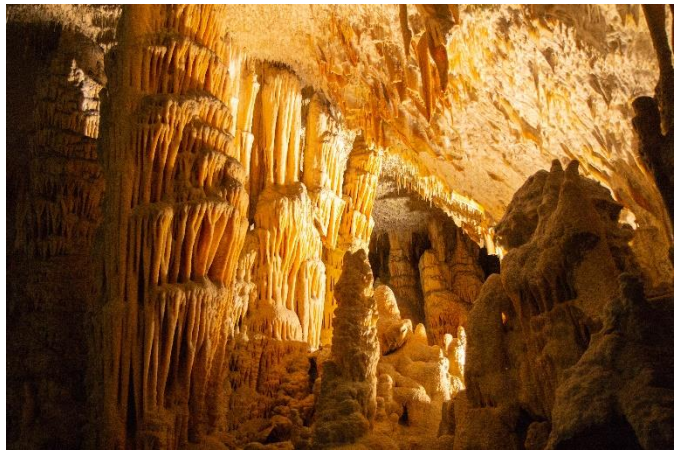
Day 5: The caves of Postojna and the castle of Predjama - night in Spodnja Idrija

Breakfast at the hotel.

Drive to Postojna. Travel time: 1 hour 10 minutes.

Explore the Postojna Caves with an audio guide in English. Entrance included with an audio guide in English and the train.

The Postojna Caves are the result of an underground river carving out two channels as it carved deeper and deeper. The abandoned channels became caves, and the humidity and percolation of water into the ground above created immense stalactites and stalagmites: a veritable labyrinth with organic walls. This is one of the largest cave systems open to the public in the world. The visit begins with a ride on a small train, followed by a guided walk into the heart of the system, before returning by train. The temperature remains constant year-round at 9°C (48°F). One of the pools also features a particular animal found only in caves: "the human fish" or "Proteus Anginus", an interesting stage in evolution because it is a fish with legs and lives up to 70 years!



Drive to Predjama. Travel time: 20 minutes. Visit Predjama Castle with an audio guide in English. Entrance included.

Nestled in the heart of a 123-meter-high cliff, this impregnable medieval marvel has stood for over 800 years. The world's largest cave castle, listed in the Guinness Book of Records, vividly recounts the story of a time when security was paramount and the clash of arms often drowned out the songs of troubadours. So special and unique, it ranks among the ten most fascinating castles in the world.



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Drive to Spodnja Idrija. Travel time: 1 hour.

Check-in at the 5-star Kendov Dvorec Hotel. Accommodation in one Superior double room and one single room. Parking included.

The Kendov Dvorec country manor is a unique 5-star hotel located in the old village of Spodnja Idrija, a member of the international Relais & Châteaux association. Kendov Dvorec's roots date back to 1377, when the first owners managed a farm overlooking the Idrijca River valley. The impressive building, which was once part of the Kenda estate, is located in Spodnja Idrija, a village that rose to prominence in 1156 with the construction of the Church of St. Mary of the Rocks. The hotel is restored in the spirit of tradition and as a tribute to the past and offers extensive gardens.



Lunch and dinner not included.

Day 6: Idrija Mercury Mines (UNESCO) - overnight stay in Spodnja Idrija

Breakfast at the hotel.

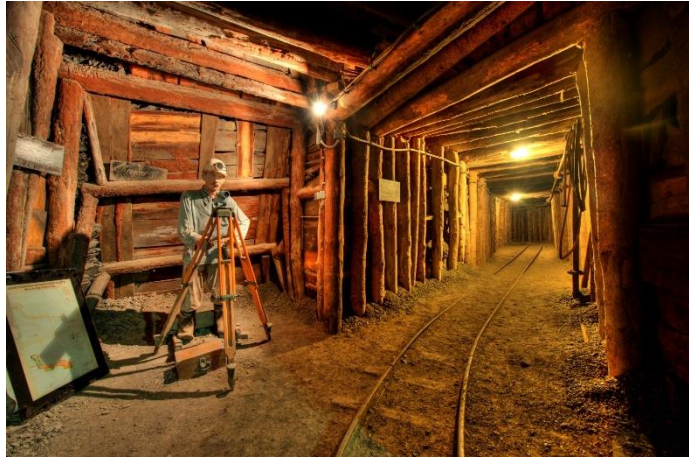
Drive to Idrija. Travel time: 15 minutes.

Explore the village and the mercury mines. Entrance fee not included, payable locally.

Idrija's half-millennium history began with the discovery of mercury. This discovery attracted many miners to the valley, which quickly saw the development of a bustling mining settlement, crowned by the Gewerkenegg Mining Castle since 1533.

Legend has it that in 1490, a bathtub maker, dipping his tub into a stream, found droplets of an unusually heavy, shiny, and unknown substance. Since that moment, Idrija, our oldest mining town, has been inextricably linked to the extremely rare and precious metal, mercury. Today, Idrija and its mysterious underground world are closely linked to the Mercury Heritage, inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List since 2012.

Since the late 17th century, Idrija has also been renowned for its lacemaking. Idrija lace is admired worldwide, and its universal value was recognized when it was inscribed on UNESCO's Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.



Return to and overnight stay at the Kendov Dvorec Hotel in Spodnja Idrija.

Lunch and dinner not included.

Day 7: Piran - overnight stay in Portorož

Breakfast at the hotel.

Drive to Piran. Travel time: 1 hour 45 minutes.

Explore Piran at your leisure.

Piran is a small seaside gem perched on a promontory. Its rich history dates back to the 7th century AD and is reflected in its medieval architecture, a blend of Venetian and Austrian styles. Piran Bay and the neighboring town of Portorož offer lovely beaches for swimming. With its maritime heritage, the town is known for its maritime museum and aquarium, which houses over 140 species of marine animals.



Drive to Portorož. Travel time: 10 minutes.

Check-in at the 5-star Kempinski Palace Hotel. Accommodation in a Superior Double Room and a Superior Single Room with sea view. Parking included.

Day 8: Rest day - overnight stay in Portorož

Breakfast at the hotel.

A day dedicated to relaxation and swimming. We recommend nearby visits: the salt pans and chocolate factory in Piran, the port of Koper, or the Lipica Stud Farm. We will provide you with further information in your itinerary.

The Port of Koper

Koper was a wealthy port long dominated by Venice, which left its mark on the city with its Gothic and later Baroque architecture. The city is full of palaces belonging to wealthy shipowners and beautiful squares.

We recommend the cathedral and the Praetorian Palace.



The Lipica Stud Farm

The Lipica Stud Farm is considered the oldest stud farm in Europe, operating continuously for over 440 years. It is here that the Lipizzan horse breed is bred, a breed used for acrobatics and to entertain nobles throughout Europe throughout history. It was chosen by the Austrian court, and this Slovenian breed with its magnificent white coat is still bred and trained at the Vienna stud farms today. The breeding of elegant white Lipizzans is an important part of Slovenia's heritage.



Return and overnight stay at the Kempinski Palace Hotel in Portorož.

Lunch and dinner not included.

Day 9: Rovinj in Croatia - overnight stay in Rovinj

Breakfast at the hotel.

Drive to Rovinj, Croatia. Travel time: 1 hour 15 minutes.

Explore Rovinj at your leisure.

Rovinj is a town that originally developed on a peninsula dominated by the church dedicated to its patron saint, Saint Euphemia. According to legend, her tomb appeared on the beach, and despite all efforts, nothing could move it. Only a shepherd's child succeeded in pushing the tomb to the top of the peninsula. Its winding streets are bustling with life, lined with artists' and artisans' shops. Its architecture is marked by Venetian heritage blended with Croatian charm. Its market is one of the liveliest in Istria. A town full of color and surprises.



Check-in at the 5-star Grand Park Hotel in Rovinj. Accommodation in two Deluxe rooms with balconies and private pools. Parking included.

Day 10: Pula and road trip across the island of Cres - overnight stay in Lošinj

Breakfast at the hotel.

Drive to Pula. Travel time: 40 minutes.

Explore Pula at your leisure.

Pula is an ancient Roman city. Its 1st-century AD amphitheater is one of the best-preserved in the world and is still used for concerts and theatrical performances. It houses a museum showcasing the Roman heritage. The city center is nearby and also illustrates this ancient past. One of the entrances is an ancient triumphal arch, and the main square was the forum with the Temple of Augustus, now a museum. It is also possible to visit the 17th-century Austrian fort in the upper part of the city. Pula has many restaurants and cafes and is very lively, like any coastal city in Istria.



Drive to Brestova, departure point for the ferry to the island of Cres. Travel time: 1 hour 15 minutes.

Ferry crossing between Brestova and Porozina on the island of Cres. Ticket included.

Navigation time: 20 min.

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Scenic route across the islands of Cres, Lošinj, and Mali Lošinj. These three islands are connected by bridges. Travel time: 1 hour 30 minutes.

Cres is one of the largest islands in Croatia. It has retained its strong and authentic island character. This natural paradise is protected and remarkable, particularly for the white-headed vulture, endemic to the island. The famous scenic route that crosses it will take you through its small fishing villages, offering splendid views of the Kvarner archipelago.



Check-in at the 5-star Alhambra Hotel in Mali Lošinj. Accommodation in a Deluxe Suite with two bedrooms, two bathrooms, a living room, and two balconies, totaling 110 square meters. Parking included.

Days 11-16: Rest days - overnight stays in Lošinj

Days dedicated to relaxation and local excursions on the islands of Mali Lošinj, Lošinj, or Cres.

Lošinj is part of the Cres-Lošinj archipelago. A small bridge connects the two islands near the town of Osor on Cres. The island's main peaks, Televrin (588 m) and Sveti Nikola (557 m), offer breathtaking views of this virtually untouched archipelago. Lošinj boasts 250 kilometers of marked hiking trails, with numerous opportunities for swimming in beautiful, secluded coves. It is said that there are 207 days of sunshine a year and over 1,000 species of aromatic herbs on the island (from rosemary and immortelle to lavender, thyme, and sage). In the seabed near Lošinj, the Apoxyomen was found, an ancient bronze sculpture depicting an athlete washing the salt and perspiration from his body. It is housed in the museum in Mali Lošinj. This part of the Adriatic is known as a haven for dolphins – we invite you to visit the Blue World Institute in Veli Lošinj, which offers educational exhibits, photos, and videos to learn more about these wonderful creatures and their lives around Lošinj. A little slice of paradise on earth, lost at sea...



Overnight stay at the Alhambra Hotel in Mali Lošinj.

Day 17: Opatija - Overnight in Ljubljana

Breakfast at the hotel.

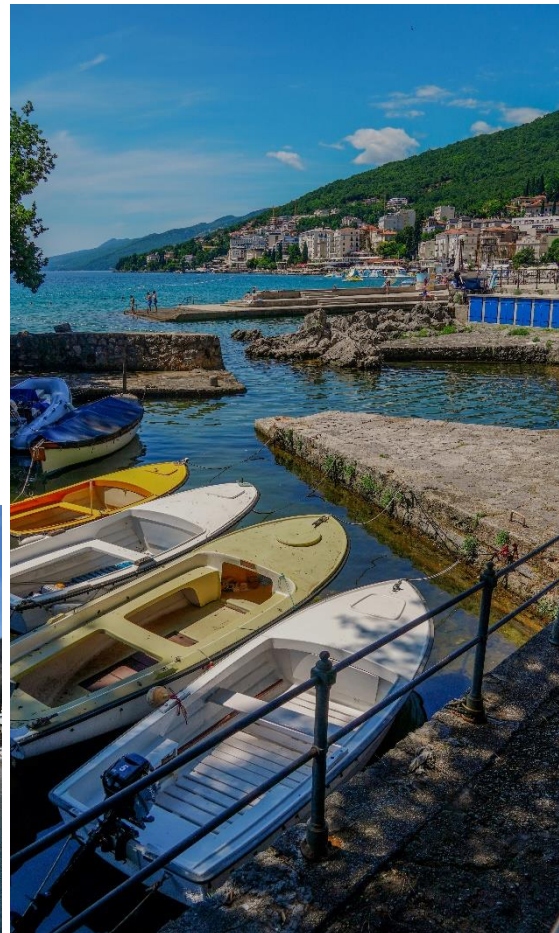
Drive to Porozina on the island of Cres. Travel time: 1 hour 30 minutes.

Ferry crossing between Porozina and Brestova. Ticket included. Crossing time: 20 minutes.

Drive to Opatija. Travel time: 40 minutes.

Explore Opatija at your leisure.

Opatija is one of Croatia's leading tourist destinations, characterized by its Art Nouveau architecture inspired by Austria. One of the first tourist destinations in Croatia and on the Adriatic Sea, Opatija attracted Central European elite from the mid-19th century onwards and remains a popular holiday destination today. Its seaside promenade, the Lungomare (the longest in Croatia at 12 km), passing by the Old Abbey, the Imperial Hotel, and Villa Angolina, is a delight of beauty, offering stunning views of the islands of Krk and Cres, as well as the city of Rijeka, Croatia's largest port.



Drive to Slovenia, then Ljubljana. Travel time: 2 hours.

Check-in at the 5-star Hotel Zlata Ladjica. Accommodation in the Zlata Ladjica Suite, measuring 61 m², with a bedroom, living room, and bathroom, connected to the Goldsmith Room for children.

This small, historic hotel was completely restored in 2020 to become a unique luxury boutique hotel in the heart of Ljubljana's historic center. Each room is different and tells its own story, intertwined with that of the city. The restaurant features only local dishes and produce. Guests can also enjoy a

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wellness area. The exceptional concierge service will make you feel like you're truly experiencing the city. The hotel holds the Green Key label for its commitment to sustainable development.



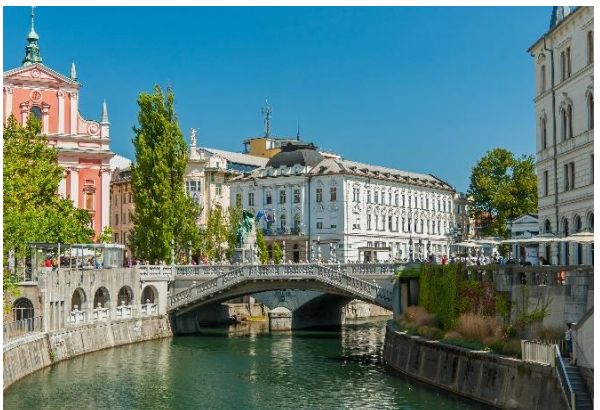

Day 18: Ljubljana, the capital of Slovenia - overnight stay in Ljubljana

Breakfast at the hotel.

Services of a local guide in English. Activity: Guided tour of Ljubljana's historic center.

Ljubljana has always been a commercial center in Slovenia, but it was Napoleon who gave it its current prominence, transforming it into the capital of Slovenia. The emperor made it the seat of the Illyrian Province, which at the time encompassed Croatia and Slovenia. During this period, numerous projects were undertaken, including the current City Hall. The city is characterized by its Baroque style, influenced by Austria, the finest example of which is St. Nicholas Cathedral. The Ljubljanica River lends a warm atmosphere to the city. A cable car departs from the center and ascends to the castle overlooking the city, offering a superb view.



Return and overnight stay at the Zlata Ladjica hotel.

Lunch and dinner not included.

Day 19: Volčji Potok Arboretum and the Velika Planina Ethnographic Village - overnight stay in Ljubljana

Breakfast at the hotel.

Drive to Volčji Potok. Travel time: 40 minutes.

Explore the Volčji Potok Arboretum at your leisure. Entrance fee not included, payable on site.

The Volčji Potok Arboretum is a vast 85-hectare park with flowerbeds and sculptures of various flowers and plants. You can stroll through it or explore it by tourist train. It is the largest arboretum in Slovenia, a paradise of flowering gardens, reflecting the Slovenian people's love of nature.



Drive to Velika Planina. Travel time: 1 hour

Explore the Velika Planina ethnographic village at your leisure.

Velika Planina offers numerous opportunities for walks and longer hikes, which you can combine with a visit to the mountain's natural and ethnological attractions. Stroll through the vast pastures, sample excellent local culinary delights, search for snow in the Vetern'ca cave, and visit the Preskar Museum in the heart of the shepherd village. Enjoy the fresh mountain air! From the upper cable car station to the Zeleni Rob hostel, an easy 30-minute trail leads gently uphill. From the hostel, walk to the shepherd village, where shepherds and natural and cultural attractions await.



Return to Ljubljana. Travel time: 1 hour 30 minutes.

Overnight stay at the Zlata Ladjica Hotel in Ljubljana.

Lunch and dinner not included.

Day 20: Departure from Ljubljana Airport

Breakfast at the hotel.

Drive to Ljubljana Airport. Travel time: 30 minutes.

Return of the rental car at Ljubljana Airport.

Departure flight.

VEHICLE DESCRIPTION

For 3 people: rental of an IFAR-category car such as a Cupra Formentor or similar...

It is of course possible to rent any other vehicle category.

RENTAL CONDITIONS:

- Unlimited mileage
- Slovenian motorway vignette
- Two drivers (to be paid on site = 50 euros total)
- Combined insurance Super CDW, WUG and PAI, which covers damage to the car regardless of who is at fault (any damage to the vehicle is charged up to a maximum amount blocked on your card, the amount depending on the type of vehicle rented); liability insurance; comprehensive and public insurance covering damage you may cause to other people or to private or public property; theft insurance. They cover damage to the bodywork, damage to exterior plastic elements, and engine damage. A security deposit is nevertheless blocked on the traveler's account when the vehicle is collected to cover any potential costs not included.

Not covered: damage to the chassis and interior of the vehicle, as well as damage resulting from traffic code violations. Damage must be documented by a police report, otherwise it will not be covered. The price per day depends on the category of the vehicle. This corresponds to what is known as "comprehensive" insurance.



NOTES:

- A credit card is required when collecting the vehicle for the security deposit, which is systematically requested (the amount is frozen for the duration of the trip and released upon return of the vehicle). Please note that American Express cards are not accepted.
- In the event of an accident or a fine, it is essential to inform Sveta Ana Agency immediately on the same day using the assistance number indicated in your travel documents, and to notify your agent by email.

- GPS (in English) in the vehicle.
- English-speaking guides. In Croatia, the law requires a licensed guide for visits to tourist sites. Licenses are issued by region. We recommend hiring one for Dubrovnik and Split, the two flagship cities of Croatia, which truly deserve expert commentary.
- "Private Trip" package with a driver, including their daily expenses and those of the vehicle (accommodation, meals, fuel, tolls, parking). The driver may be a professional English-speaking tour escort. Please note that someone who is driving cannot always provide commentary while on the road. Their services cannot be the same as those of an escort dedicated solely to commentary. It is possible to have both an escort and a driver, bearing in mind that city guided tours must be carried out by local licensed guides, which are additional.
An estimate of the cost for a English-speaking driver-escort: €450.00 per day + single-room accommodation with dinners (vehicle rental must be added to this).
Prices for Private Trips with a driver may be lower, but should be checked.
- Possibility of creating a payment link allowing you to pay by credit card, thereby benefiting from the related advantages (notably travel insurance), for an additional 3% of the total trip cost.

INSURANCE

The Sveta Ana agency does not sell insurance other than vehicle insurance. We recommend that you be covered by Trip Cancellation insurance and "comprehensive" insurance for the vehicle. In the event of partial or complete cancellation of the trip or damage to the vehicle, we will assist you in preparing the necessary documents for the travel insurance (a confirmation letter from the agency and a paid invoice, possibly including a calculation of the costs of unused services). Credit cards (Gold, Privilege, Premium, etc.) often include this insurance if the trip is paid with them. Check with your bank or its insurance provider to know when the insurance file must be opened. Often, it must be done when signing the travel contract or when paying the first deposit.

CANCELLATION CONDITIONS

Any cancellation must be sent by email to the local agency. The cancellation fees depend on the date the cancellation occurs:

- More than 31 days before departure: 30% of the trip price
- Between 30 and 16 days before departure: 50% of the trip price
- Between 15 days before departure and the day of arrival: 100% of the trip price
