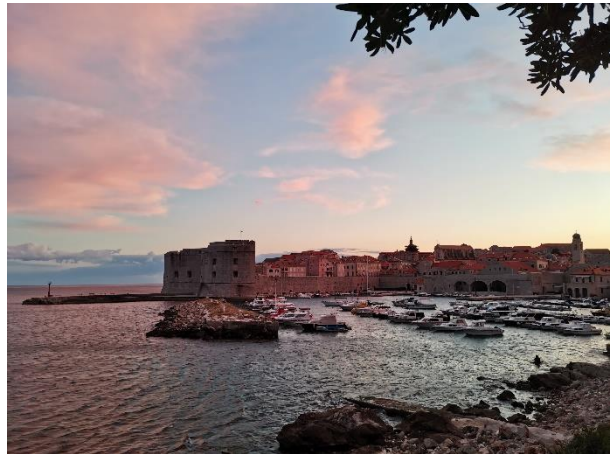
### INTRODUCTION

Croatia is surprising from the outset because of its unusual shape. The arc that defines the country is explained by its history and by the unique factors that contribute to the richness and diversity of today's Croatia. The country combines a long coastal stretch with one of the world's highest concentrations of islands, shaped by its Mediterranean setting, and continental Pannonian plains closely linked to the Austro-Hungarian plains. These two landscape regions are framed by the Julian Alps to the north and the Dinaric ranges descending all the way to Greece.

Whether on the coast or in the plains, Croats have always been a nation of traders, benefitting from their position at the crossroads of multiple trade routes, many of which date back to Antiquity and even earlier. The Roman heritage is most vividly expressed in the city of **Split**, whose old town lies within the walls of Emperor Diocletian's palace, a place that has reinvented itself through history to form a vibrant blend of architectural styles in perpetual evolution.

The turbulent medieval past can be read in Venetian influences along the coast, in cities such as **Hvar**, **Korčula** and **Šibenik**, and in Austrian influences further inland. Croatia's strategic position and wealth have long aroused envy. The country's joy and melancholy are reflected both in the highly original naïve art typical of the plains and in the refined stone-carving tradition of Dalmatia, whose craftsmen achieved true artistic revolutions—most notably the Cathedral of **Šibenik**, created by George the Dalmatian.

Amid these historical ebbs and flows, the small Republic of **Dubrovnik** developed into an extraordinary city-state, marked by its own distinctive art and architecture and fiercely protective of its freedom through exceptional diplomacy.



Travelling across Croatia means discovering a wide variety of landscapes and terroirs that are constantly changing, each harboring strong, original identities shaped by the many influences that have left their mark. This journey will take you through natural gems on the islands of **Hvar** and **Korčula** and the **Mljet Island National Park**, or across high plateaus to the Krka River National Park... A wealth that also delights the palate, expressed through an appetizing diversity of culinary specialties. From Mediterranean maritime aromas to the gentle sounds of waterfalls... a total pleasure for the senses!

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## **PROGRAM**

### **Day 1: Arrival at Split Airport – Overnight in Split**

Arrival flight at Split Airport.

Meet & greet with your driver and private transfer (Mercedes V-Class) from Split Airport to Hotel Ambassador in Split. Duration of the transfer: 30 minutes.

Check-in at the 5\* Hotel Ambassador. Accommodation in a Premium double room with king-size bed, balcony, and sea & Old Town view, with a surface area of 30–37 m<sup>2</sup>.

### **Day 2 : Split (UNESCO) - Overnight in Split**

Breakfast at the hotel.

Meet your guide at the hotel reception.

Services of a local English-speaking guide: Guided tour of the historic center of Split (duration: approximately 1.5–2 hours).

*Split is unique because it is a living monument. The original Roman palace was continuously transformed throughout history, with each era leaving its mark, creating a vibrant mix of architectural styles. Today, it forms the centre of Croatia's second-largest city and its second busiest port. Its cathedral is the oldest in the world and a remarkable illustration of Split's spirit, as it was originally the mausoleum of the empire's greatest persecutor of Christians, Emperor*



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Diocletian. The paradoxically well-preserved state of Diocletian's Palace earned it UNESCO World Heritage status. You will discover an extraordinary monument!

Return and overnight at Hotel Ambassador in Split.  
Lunch and dinner not included.

### **Day 3: Krka River National Park and Šibenik (UNESCO) – Overnight in Split**

Breakfast at the hotel.

Services of a local English-speaking guide. Activity: Accompaniment for the excursion to Krka National Park and Šibenik.

Private car transport for the excursion (Mercedes V Class).

Drive to Lozovac, one of the entrances to Krka National Park. Travel time: 1 hour

Discovery of Krka National Park with the guide (entrance included).

The private car will drop you off at the Lozovac entrance. You will visit the ethnographic village, then stroll through the forest crossed by waterways along the Skradinski Buk waterfall complex. From there, you will take the national park boat to the village of Skradin, where your driver will be waiting.

*Krka National Park encompasses the Krka River, connecting continental and Mediterranean climates. Its course forms canyons interrupted by magnificent waterfalls. An ethnographic village at Lozovac showcases traditional crafts such as watermills, forges, and weaving. Easy paths allow visitors to wander through a forest threaded with waterways.*



Drive to Šibenik. Travel time: 20 minutes.  
Exploration of Šibenik at your leisure. *Šibenik is a picturesque Dalmatian town founded by the Croats, unlike other Dalmatian cities of ancient origin. This royal town, home to numerous fortresses, is famous for its Cathedral of St. James, an unparalleled architectural achievement that earned it UNESCO World Heritage status. Šibenik is also one of the few Croatian towns with a beautiful beach near its historic center.*



Return and overnight stay at the Ambassador Hotel in Split.  
Lunch and dinner not included.

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**Day 4: Relaxation Day on the Island of Hvar – Overnight in Hvar Stari Grad**

Breakfast at the hotel.

11:00 AM: Private speedboat transfer (Ranieri Voyager 21 S) from the Ambassador Hotel in Split to the Maslina Resort in Stari Grad on the island of Hvar. Travel time: 45 minutes – 1 hour



Check-in at Maslina Resort 5\*.

Accommodation: Pool Suite with a double bed.

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### **Days 5 to 8: Relaxation Days on the Island of Hvar – Overnights in Hvar Stari Grad**

These conditions have contributed to the development of tourism on the island, similar to Dubrovnik or Opatija, since the late 19th century. The town of Hvar reflects Venetian influences while preserving the character of Dalmatian ports with their stone architecture. Historically, and continuing today, Hvar attracts the global elite with its magical setting.*

### **Day 9: Private Boat Transfer to Korta Katarina 5\* Hotel in Orebić – Overnight in Orebić**

Breakfast at the hotel.

11:00 AM: Private boat transfer (Colnago 45) from Maslina Resort to Korta Katarina Hotel in Orebić. The journey is a beautiful mini cruise of approximately 1 hour 30 minutes, passing along the islands of Hvar, Korčula, and the tip of the Pelješac Peninsula.

### **Day 10: Korčula, the Birthplace of Marco Polo – Overnight in Orebić**

Breakfast at the hotel.

2:00 PM: Transfer with the hotel's boat (Colnago 45) to the town of Korčula (schedules can be adjusted locally if desired).

Travel time: 15 minutes

Exploration of Korčula at your leisure. *Korčula reflects the spirit of the Dalmatian islands, shaped by Venetian presence and influences from the Republic of Dubrovnik. Its history is particularly marked by the brotherhoods, which remain active to this day. An important maritime port in the Middle Ages, Korčula is the birthplace of the great merchant and traveler Marco Polo. The island is renowned for its olive oil*



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and wines. Regular boat connections link it to the islands of Mljet and Hvar, as well as to the cities of Dubrovnik and Split. Its waters are exceptionally clear, making it a paradise for swimming.

5:00 PM: Transfer by the hotel's boat (Colnago 45) from Korčula back to Korta Katarina Hotel (schedules can be adjusted locally if desired).

Return and overnight stay at Korta Katarina Hotel in Orebić.

You are on full board during your entire stay at this hotel, allowing you to dine at times convenient for you, coordinated with the chefs or concierge service.

Lunch and dinner at the hotel.

### **Day 11: Mljet Island National Park, following in the footsteps of Ulysses – Overnight in Orebić**

Breakfast at the hotel.

9:00 AM: Transfer by the hotel's boat (Colnago 45) to the village of Pomena, one of the entrances to Mljet Island National Park (schedules can be arranged locally if desired). Travel time: 45 minutes

Exploration of Mljet Island National Park at your leisure (entrance included)

We recommend visiting Saint Mary Islet with its 11th-century monastery.

*Mljet is the island of the Odyssey, where Ulysses is said to have stayed ... in the arms of the nymph Calypso for seven beautiful years. Pine and oak forests cover much of the island, a third of which is part of the national park. Its unique feature is two lakes connected to each other and linked to the sea by a narrow channel. On the larger lake, there is even an island—an island within an island! This unusual formation was created by rising waters around 10,000 BC, giving rise to exceptional flora and fauna. On Saint Mary Islet, you'll find an ancient Benedictine monastery from the Middle Ages, now hosting a restaurant. The site is ideal for swimming, as the lake water is warmer than the sea. Walking here will quickly make you understand why Ulysses never wanted to leave.*



5:00 PM: Transfer by the hotel's boat (Colnago 45) from Pomena back to Korta Katarina Hotel (schedules can be arranged locally if desired).

Return and overnight stay at Korta Katarina Hotel in Orebić.

You are on full-board during your entire stay at this hotel, allowing you to dine at times convenient for you, coordinated with the chefs or concierge service.

Lunch and dinner at the hotel.

*Pelješac is the longest peninsula in Croatia, a land of wild beauty with its coves and crystal-clear waters. It is renowned for its wines, particularly Dingač, produced in the Potomje vineyard, considered among the best red wines in the country.*



Exploration of Ston Veliki at your leisure.

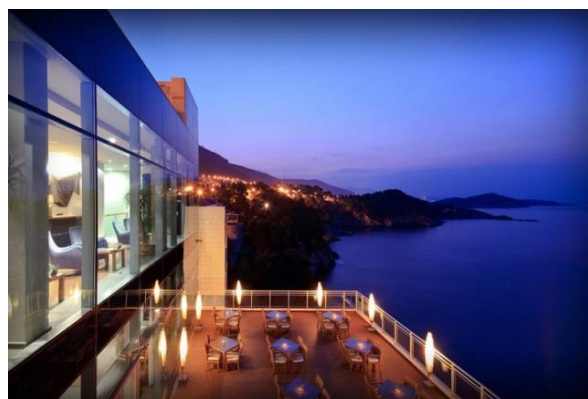
*The village of Ston is located where the Pelješac Peninsula meets the mainland. It is known for mariculture, particularly the farming of Mediterranean oysters—a specialty not to be missed! The village is also home to the salt pans of the former Republic of Dubrovnik, which are still in operation today. However, its most remarkable landmark is its city walls, among the longest in Europe—a true feat of human engineering!*



Coastal Drive to Dubrovnik. Travel time: 1 hour

Check-in at Bellevue Hotel 5\*. Accommodation: Superior Room with Double Bed, Sea View, and Balcony. <https://www.adriaticluxuryhotels.com/hotel-bellevue-dubrovnik/rooms-and-suites/superior-room-bel/>

*Bellevue Hotel is a 5-star property overlooking Miramare Bay, perched atop a 30-meter cliff. Below, there is a beautiful semi-private beach accessible only via the hotel's elevator. The historic center of Dubrovnik is a 10-minute walk along the sea, offering stunning views. With only 91 rooms, the hotel is a small oasis of peace and beauty. It features an indoor pool and a wellness area, while its eclectic and original design adds to its exceptional setting.*

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### **Day 14 : Dubrovnik (UNESCO) – Overnight in Dubrovnik**

Breakfast at the hotel.

Walk to Dubrovnik: 10–15 minutes. You can also request a taxi at the hotel reception, or taxis are available just outside the Old Town to return to the hotel.

Services of a Local English-Speaking Guide. Activity : Guided tour of Dubrovnik’s historic center.

*Dubrovnik was a Mediterranean city-state that preserved its freedom and avoided conflicts through skilled diplomacy. It abolished slavery as early as the 15th century, implemented hygiene measures that prevented major epidemics, and ensured uniform façades to prevent social unrest—remarkable features of this forward-thinking system. The scale of its commerce is reflected in every stone of this city, which is among the best-preserved medieval towns in the world. Known as the “Pearl of the Adriatic” and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Dubrovnik is*



*a highlight of Croatian tourism, surprising visitors with its exceptional beauty and culture at the crossroads of Europe, the Mediterranean, and the Near East.*

We recommend visiting the Rector’s Palace, the Franciscan Monastery for its historic pharmacy, and the Dominican Monastery for its collection of typical Dubrovnik paintings, not to mention the imposing city walls!

From Dubrovnik’s Old Town, you have the following options:

- Swimming at Banje Beach, located just east of the Old Town. This is Dubrovnik’s most famous beach, frequented by personalities such as Jackie Kennedy, John Malkovich, Nick Nolte, Roger Moore, and the Queen of England.
- Cable car and Mount Srđ, featuring Napoleon’s Imperial Fort, now a museum on the Yugoslav Wars.
- Boat to Lokrum Island, a natural gem with an 11th-century Benedictine monastery. The crossing takes 15 minutes. Napoleon built a fortress there, later occupied and enhanced by the Habsburgs. Lokrum Island features a rich botanical garden and is now a protected nature reserve, with scenic walks, a café, and a restaurant. It is a popular swimming spot for Dubrovnik residents.
- Sea kayaking along the city walls or other sporting activities (jet skiing, parasailing, diving, etc.)

Return and overnight stay at Bellevue Hotel in Dubrovnik.

Lunch and dinner not included.

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**Day 15: Private sailing cruise in the Elaphiti Islands – overnight stay in Dubrovnik**

Breakfast at the hotel.

9:45 AM – Private car transfer with a French-speaking driver (Mercedes E Class) from Hotel Bellevue to Dubrovnik's main port, called Gruž. Travel time: 10 minutes.

The principle of a private cruise is that you can set the itinerary with the skipper according to your wishes. The boat is reserved for the entire day.



*The Elaphiti Islands are the southernmost archipelago of Croatia and the Adriatic Sea. They consist of 13 islands, of which 3 are still inhabited today. Koločep was an ancient Greek colony dating back to the 4th century BC, and it features charming small pre-Romanesque Croatian churches and a protected nature park with beautiful, easy hiking trails. The island of Lopud is known for its maritime tradition, as evidenced by its historic palaces. It is also famous for its stunning sandy beach, Šunj. Šipán has a high concentration of olive trees and is called "The Golden Island." The village of Suđurađ offers the only fully restored noble residence from the former Republic of Dubrovnik that is open to visitors, providing insight into the region's traditional rural architecture. The Elaphiti Islands are renowned for their exceptionally clear waters. This cruise will take you on a journey between dream and reality, in a landscape of almost untouched beauty.*



You will first sail to the island of Koločep, where there is a Blue Cave. This phenomenon occurs because the cave is partially filled with seawater. Daylight enters through the cave's opening, which lies just

below the water surface, creating bluish reflections on the walls. Koločep is a protected nature park with beautiful hiking trails. Sailing duration: 1 hour

Next, continue to the island of Lopud, home to wealthy shipowners and famous for its lovely sandy beaches. Sailing duration: 1 hour  
Free time and lunch at one of the many seaside restaurants.

5:00 PM – Return to Dubrovnik by boat.



Private car transfer from Dubrovnik port back to Hotel Bellevue. Travel time: 10 minutes.  
Return and overnight stay at Hotel Bellevue in Dubrovnik.

#### **Day 16: Day of leisure – overnight stay in Dubrovnik**

#### **Day 17: Cavtat and gourmet peka lunch at Konavoski Dvori restaurant – overnight stay in Dubrovnik**

Breakfast at the hotel.

9:30 AM – Private car transport (Mercedes E Class) with a French-speaking driver for the excursion.  
Drive to Cavtat.

Travel time: 40 minutes.

Discovery of Cavtat at your leisure.

*Cavtat is one of the most beautiful villages on the Dubrovnik Riviera. It was for its unique natural position, protected by two headlands jutting into the sea, that the Romans chose this enchanting place to found the colony of Epidaurus. When it was destroyed upon the arrival of the Croats, the refugees went on to found Dubrovnik – thus the histories of the two towns are closely intertwined. Today, Cavtat is a typical stone village with grand captains' houses, renowned for its restaurants, cafés, and its magnificent seaside*



*promenade. It is home to a mausoleum created by the famous Croatian sculptor Ivan Meštrović, a Franciscan monastery, and the birthplace of the notable Impressionist artist Vlaho Bukovac. A little gem full of colors, where it feels wonderful to simply enjoy life...*

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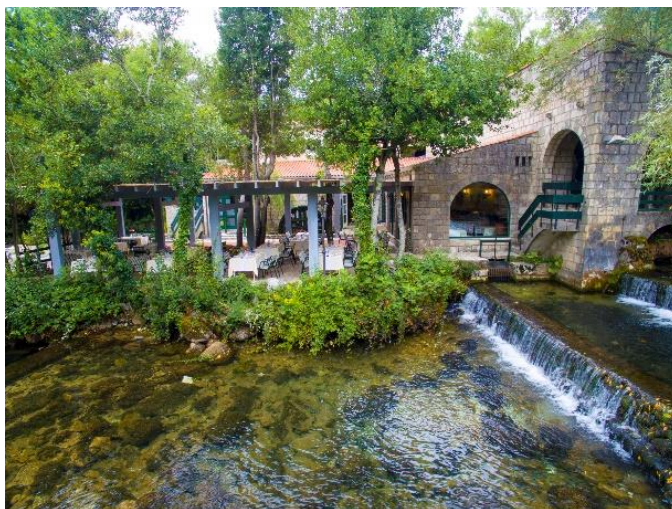
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Drive to the hamlet of Ljuta. Travel time: 20 minutes.

Lunch at the renowned restaurant Konavoski Dvori.

*Konavoski Dvori means “the palaces of Konavle.” It was originally a large complex of watermills powered by the Ljuta River (meaning “the furious one”). During the Yugoslav era, part of the complex was restored to create one of the most famous restaurants in all of southern Croatia. And while other restaurants may claim fine gastronomy in the Dubrovnik region, the tradition and setting of Konavoski Dvori remain unmatched. The waitresses wear traditional costumes, and the food is entirely organic. The natural surroundings are magical.*



Cooking under the bell, known as *peka*, a very unique method :

*The principle is that veal and lamb, along with potatoes seasoned with herbs, are placed on a dish set over a bed of embers. It is then covered with a bell-shaped dome fitted with a metal ring so that embers can also be placed on top. The cooking process lasts about three hours. The food becomes crispy on the outside and meltingly tender on the inside... and with a glass of local wine, it's an absolute delight!*

- A roadbook including a detailed itinerary, a file with presentations of tourist sites to visit (history, information), and various practical information about the country (restaurant references, parking locations, recommended addresses).
- 24/7 assistance from the Sveta Ana agency in French. An emergency number is provided in case of incidents or major problems.
- Tourist taxes, assistance fees, insurance, and organization fees of the Sveta Ana agency.

### **NOTE:**

Travel times are given for normal driving conditions and are for guidance only, as they may vary due to random factors such as roadworks, accidents, traffic jams, or bad weather.

### **CANCELLATION POLICY**

All cancellations must be sent by email to the local agency. The amount of cancellation fees depends on the timing of the cancellation:

- More than 31 days before departure: 30% of the trip price
- Between 30 and 16 days before departure: 50% of the trip price
- Between 15 days before departure and the day of arrival: 100% of the trip price
